CALL TO ORDER

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

TEXT AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE 18 SIGNS – ZONING ORDINANCE

Mayor Knight advised the council that the Rutledge Zoning ordinance does not allow electronic signs. He stated that the text amendment would be in line with the Morgan County ordinance and would allow gas stations to have one with digital numbers. The amendment allows one digital sign per gasoline retailer.

Bruce Altznauer asked if this would affect the Caboose and Yesterday's café. Mayor Knight said no, it will only affect gas stations.

CITIZEN INPUT

Mayor Knight called for citizen input for or against the text amendment. There was none. Bruce Altznauer made motion to approve the text amendment to article 18 allowing one digital sign per gasoline retailer.

Brenda Thompson seconded, all voted in favor and motion carried.

APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION FOR THE DISASTER MITIGATION ACT OF 2000 AUTHORIZING THE ADOPTION OF MORGAN COUNTY PLAN

Tim Smith seconded, all voted in favor and motion carried.
